Mr. Blanton noted that no action was taken.

7. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES – SCDOT COUNTRY CLUB ROAD IMPROVEMENTS WATER AND SEWER RELOCATIONS

At the March 2020 meeting, the Commission approved the award of a professional services contract to Summit Engineering Group to assist Spartanburg Water with the identification of conflicts, development of water and sewer relocation plans for the conflicts, coordination with the SCDOT, and necessary permitting. The professional services contract was based on an hourly rate schedule with a not to exceed amount of \$30,000 for SSSD and \$40,000 for SWS for total of \$70,000.

An amendment to the professional services contract is needed to change the professional services contract from an hourly rate, with a not to exceed amount, to a lump sum amount. The change is needed due to the need for additional design services and to add construction administration services. The amendment increases the total reimbursement for services and is based on the amounts included in the Memorandum of Agreement between the Spartanburg Sanitary Sewer District and the SCDOT. The amounts are based on a percentage of the total construction cost estimates and completed construction plans. Based on the Memorandum of Agreement with the SCDOT, the professional services will be partially reimbursed by the SCDOT.

Management recommended the approval of the amendment of the professional services contract with Summit Engineering Group to a Lump Sum amount of \$36,800 to SSSD and \$116,600 to SWS for a total amount of \$153,400. Funding for this project is from capital funds.

Gene Jackson provided the Commission with an overview of the SCDOT Country Club Road Improvements Water and Sewer Relocations project.

Mr. Montgomery moved and Mr. Horton seconded the motion to approve management's recommendation to approve the amendment of the professional services contract with Summit Engineering Group to a Lump Sum amount of \$36,800 to SSSD. The motion passed unanimously.

8. OWNERSHIP AGREEMENT – ASHWOOD MEADOWS

Deep River South Development, LLC proposes to construct approximately 3,150 linear feet of 8-inch gravity sewer line to provide service to 105 residential lots in the Ashwood Meadows subdivision located off of Old Furnace Road and Asheville Highway. The sewer line will connect to the existing SSSD infrastructure. The domestic waste will be treated at the A. Manning Lynch Wastewater Treatment Facility. The developer will bear all costs.

The line will be constructed according to District-approved plans and specifications, with District inspection provided. The owner will provide all necessary right-of-way and easement agreements for this project.

The form of the agreement transferring ownership of the gravity sewer to the District has been reviewed by the District's attorney and executed by Deep River South Development, LLC. Under the terms of the resolution adopted by the Commission on May 29, 1990, this agreement has been executed on behalf of the Commission by the Chief Executive Officer.

The above was provided as information to the Commission.

9. OWNERSHIP AGREEMENT - CHUMLEY ESTATES

Lyonjay, LLC proposes to construct approximately 3,762 linear feet of 8-inch gravity sewer line to provide service to 84 residential lots in Chumley Estates located off of Lightwood Knot Road in Reidville. The sewer line will connect to the existing SSSD infrastructure. The domestic waste will be treated at the South Tyger River Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility. The developer will bear all costs.

The line will be constructed according to District-approved plans and specifications, with District inspection provided. The owner will provide all necessary right-of-way and easement agreements for this project. The form of the agreement transferring ownership of the gravity sewer to the District has been reviewed by the District's attorney and executed by Lyonjay, LLC. Under the terms of the resolution adopted by the Commission on May 29, 1990, this agreement has been executed on behalf of the Commission by the Chief Executive Officer.

The above was provided as information to the Commission.

10. OWNERSHIP AGREEMENT - CLEVELAND MEADOWS SUBDIVISION

ECS Development, LLC proposes to construct approximately 2,290 linear feet of 12-inch gravity sewer line, and 11,900 linear feet of 8-inch gravity sewer line; 5,206 linear feet of 8-inch force main; and 522 GPM pump station to provide service to 407 residential lots in the Cleveland Meadows subdivision located off of Hope Road. The force main will discharge to the existing SSSD infrastructure. The domestic waste will be treated at the Lower North Tyger River Wastewater Treatment Facility. SSSD will participate in the off-site sewer construction cost in accordance with the Sewer Extension Policy adopted December 17, 1996.

The line will be constructed according to District-approved plans and specifications, with District inspection provided. The owner will provide all necessary right-of-way and easement agreements for this project.

The form of the agreement transferring ownership of the gravity sewer to the District has been reviewed by the District's attorney and executed by ECS Development, LLC. Under the terms of the resolution adopted by the Commission on May 29, 1990, this agreement has been executed on behalf of the Commission by the Chief Executive Officer.

The above was provided as information to the Commission.

11. OWNERSHIP AGREEMENT - REIDVILLE TOWN CENTER

Reidville Road Properties II, LLC proposes to construct approximately 11,373 linear feet of 8-inch gravity sewer line to provide service to 290 residential lots in Reidville Town Center located off of Reidville Road in Reidville. The sewer line will connect to the existing SSSD infrastructure. The domestic waste will be treated at the South Tyger River Regional Wastewater

Treatment Facility. SSSD will participate in the off-site sewer construction cost in accordance with the Sewer Extension Policy adopted December 17, 1996.

The line will be constructed according to District-approved plans and specifications, with District inspection provided. The owner will provide all necessary right-of-way and easement agreements for this project.

The form of the agreement transferring ownership of the gravity sewer to the District has been reviewed by the District's attorney and executed by Reidville Road Properties II, LLC. Under the terms of the resolution adopted by the Commission on May 29, 1990, this agreement has been executed on behalf of the Commission by the Chief Executive Officer.

The above was provided as information to the Commission.

12. NEGOTIATIONS AND MISCELLANEOUS ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

- A. Bobby Walden informed the Commission that Janet Cann, Asset Engineering Manager, was selected as the 2022 Spartanburg Woman of Accomplishment at the Spartanburg Chapter of Business Professional Women Breakfast on March 17.
- B. Newt Pressley noted that Spartanburg Water Choose Tap Program has supported PAL with the annual Criterium since 2016. Over 700 reusable water bottles were handed out and thousands of gallons of water given away. A total of 35 coolers and 1,000 paper cups were provided to PAL for use in sponsor tents throughout the event in place of bottled water.
- C. Newt Pressley stated that Choose Tap will participate in the SPACE fundraiser, "A Flocking Good Time," on April 28 at Glendale Shoals.
- D. Newt Pressley informed the Commission that Spartanburg Water has resumed accepting reservations for Rainbow Lake Pavilion #1 for dates on or after Sunday, May 1, 2022.
- E. Newt Pressley noted that the Ten at the Top Upstate Summit is scheduled for May 10 and will be held at the Greenville Convention Center.
- F. Newt Pressley stated that the Upstate SC Alliance 2022 Annual Meeting will be held on May 13 and will be held at the Greenville Convention Center.
- G. Newt Pressley informed the Commission that Spartanburg Water will partner with BMW to provide the Choose Tap Oasis for the two days the BMW Charity Pro-Am tournament takes place at the Carolina Country Club on June 9 and June 10.
- **H.** Newt Pressley noted the ACE Conference is scheduled for June 12-15 and will be held in San Antonio, Texas.
